3. What do you mean by Design Act, 2000? Explain the process and object for registration of design under the Act. 25
4. Trace the history of Geographical Indications in India with special reference to the Basmati Controversy. 25
5. Ms. Priya Gupta, a renowned photo-journalist, was hired by 'YYTV' as a Special Reporter. She was deputed to Chhattisgarh to report on the activities of Naxals. She presented live programs and wrote many articles in their print versions "YY NEWS". After the successful mission, she was back to her normal work. Later she prepared a documentary in a CD format captioning "Role of Red Brigade" and released it on her own. YYTV sued her for alleged use of information.
